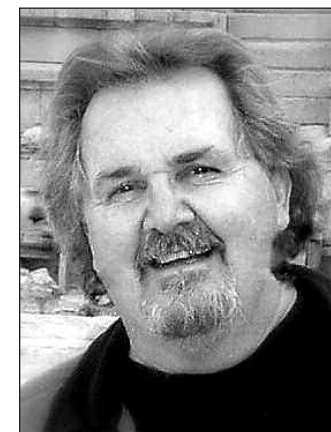

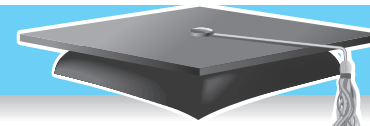

Save the Carnegie Library Campaign

Nearly 100 years ago, philanthropist Andrew Carnegie, believing in real and permanent good, offered the City of Thief River Falls the sum of \$12,500 to build a public library. The City met Mr. Carnegie's requirements by matching this with \$4,848 in local funding and built the stately Carnegie Library building that still stands at the corner of Main Ave and 1st Street.

A "Save the Carnegie Library" campaign has been started with the goal of restoring the Carnegie to its original grandeur and making it an integral part of the community. The cost to do this is not insignificant, but we believe that coupled with a goal to make this building a valuable community resource, its restoration will pay huge dividends.

The estimated cost to restore the Carnegie Library building is \$900,000. The City was awarded a \$99,000 Legacy Grant in the first round of funding from the Minnesota Historical Society. This grant, when combined with current pledges of more than \$350,000 means a total of \$450,000 to start this project. We are half-way there!

The architect for the project is Michael J. Burns (MJBA) from Fargo, specializing in historic restorations and preservation. MJBA also worked on the TRF Soo Line Depot, which is now City Hall. Restoration of the Carnegie will begin in September.

Grants

The Thief River Falls Education Foundation is pleased to announce the following grants which were approved at the April 27, 2010 Board of Directors meeting.

- The Close-Up Program at Lincoln High School. This program sends students to Washington DC to see how government works.
- Guest artist for "Electrify Your Strings" program. Mark Wood, internationally famous recording artist will work with our orchestra students with electric violins and then perform with the orchestra in a concert..
- Leveled Literacy Intervention Kit for grades 3-5. This system coordinates with the Literacy Collaborative at Challenger and can prevent literacy difficulties before they turn into long-term challenges.
- SmartBoard for Health/PE Department at Lincoln High School. The SmartBoard allows full access of computer-based curriculum while incorporating various learning styles by taking advantage of digital tools for differentiated instruction.
- Vernier Labquest equipment to complete 1 classroom set at Lincoln High School. Ninth grade students have a mandatory technology course and the additional equipment will allow students to work in pairs rather than groups of 4 or 5.
- iMac desktop computers for yearbook staff at Lincoln High School. Yearbooks are now being created and published using an internet-based publication program and there is a need for faster, newer computers for the yearbook staff to use.
- Books that focus on social-emotional development as well as social skills at Challenger Elementary School. These books will help students learn appropriate coping mechanisms for dealing with stress in their lives.
- Junior Golf Program for Community Education. This program teaches youth about good sportsmanship, etiquette, community pride, and the skills and fundamentals of the
